

DOGGR Onshore Facilities Compliance (AB 1960)

In January 2011, California legislation AB 1960 went into effect and established minimum standards for onshore production facilities. The new regulations, administered and enforced by the California Department of Oil, Gas & Geothermal Resources (DOGGR), contain increased maintenance and testing requirements for onshore operators.

- Prepare or modify existing spill contingency plans (SCP or SPCC) and site plans to ensure they meet the latest requirements
- File plans with the appropriate DOGGR office within the prescribed timelines
- Prepare blowout prevention and control plans for critical or high-pressure wells
- Prepare pipeline management plans
- Advise on the new testing frequencies for tank foundations, bottom and side plates, leak detection systems, etc.
- Conduct mock audits to ensure the facility meets the latest requirements of DOGGR
- Verify distances to environmentally sensitive resources and determine how these may affect your operations
- Recommend preventive maintenance procedures designed to prevent leakage or reduced operating pressure due to excessive corrosion
- Ensure personnel are properly trained and accurate training and qualifications records are properly maintained
- Ensure full compliance with facility documentation retention requirements
